INTRODUCTION

The academic year 2025–2026 commenced with renewed enthusiasm, aspirations, and a commitment to excellence. Our institution continues to strive not only for academic achievement but also for the holistic development of students, equipping them to meet the demands of a dynamic and competitive world. This report presents a glimpse of the significant events and milestones of the year.

ACADEMIC YEAR INAUGURATION

The new academic year commenced on June 2, 2025, with students returning to school with great enthusiasm. The day began with an assembly led by Class X students, and the Principal, Rev. Fr. Josh Kanjooparambil SDB, extended a warm welcome to all.

The formal inauguration of the academic year was held on June 4, 2025. The ceremony was presided over by the Rector and Manager, Rev. Fr. Antony Vailatt SDB, in the presence of students from Classes 1 to 12. The Principal welcomed the gathering and introduced the new teachers and students who joined the institution this year.

The inauguration of the Senior Secondary session and the welcoming of Plus One students were held on June 10, 2025.

SCHOOL ELECTION

The Student Parliament Election was conducted in a systematic manner, providing students with an opportunity to experience the democratic process and understand the value of responsible leadership.

The School Election was formally held in two phases on June 13 and June 17, 2025, for different sections of the school. A total of 953 students cast their votes. The election concluded successfully with the selection of the new student council members, who are entrusted with upholding the values and responsibilities of the institution.

INVESTITURE CEREMONY & INAUGURATION OF HOUSE AND CLUB SYSTEM

The Investiture Ceremony was held on June 20, 2025. The function was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Jyothis Malayil SDB, Administrator of Don Bosco S. Puram.

During the ceremony, the newly elected school leaders were ceremoniously adorned with badges and sashes by the esteemed Rector and Manager, Rev. Fr. Antony Vailatt SDB. Embracing the mantle of leadership, the student council solemnly pledged to discharge their responsibilities with integrity, dedication, and excellence.

The inauguration of the House and Club systems, held on the same day, marked a renewed commitment to fostering camaraderie, creativity, and holistic development among students through vibrant co-curricular engagement.

SCHOOL HOUSE SYSTEM

The House System continues to be an integral part of the School's culture, promoting unity, teamwork, and a spirit of healthy competition among students. All major activities and events are organized under the four houses, providing students with ample opportunities to participate actively, develop leadership qualities, and build strong bonds across classes.

CLUB SYSTEM

The Club System was inaugurated on June 12, 2025, with the aim of nurturing the talents and interests of students beyond the classroom. This year, four new clubs—Guitar, Kickboxing, Skateboarding, and Table Tennis—were introduced, increasing the total number of clubs to 20.

A total of 748 students from Classes 2 to 10 enrolled in various clubs, actively participating and exploring their individual interests. The Club System continues to encourage creativity, skill development, and a spirit of independent learning among students.

SCHOOL COUNSELLING UNIT

The School Counselling Unit functions effectively, offering guidance and support for the emotional and psychological well-being of students. Under the dedicated guidance of the School Counsellor, Ms. Anumol Joshy, students are helped to face academic, social, and personal challenges with confidence and resilience.

BOSCO RADIO

Bosco Radio sessions were conducted regularly on Tuesdays and Fridays, providing a vibrant platform for students to express their ideas and showcase their talents. These sessions help in enhancing communication skills, creativity, and confidence among students in an encouraging environment.

WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY

World Environment Day was observed on June 5, 2025, under the guidance of the Science Department, emphasizing the importance of environmental awareness and sustainability. As a symbolic gesture, a sapling was presented to the Principal, Rev. Fr. Josh Kanjooparambil SDB, marking the commitment of the school towards a greener future.

As part of the extended celebrations, an Eco-Friendly Fancy Dress Competition was organized on July 9, 2025, for students of Classes 1 to 4, encouraging creativity while spreading awareness about environmental protection.

INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY

International Yoga Day was celebrated on June 23, 2025, under the leadership of the Yoga Club. The programme began with a special assembly in which students demonstrated various yoga postures, reflecting discipline and dedication.

SAHODAYA KALOLSAVAM 2025

The Kottayam Sahodaya Sargasangamam 2025 was held from October 9 to 12 at Placid Vidya Vihar, where our students showcased remarkable talent and secured the overall 12th position.

A total of 141 students participated in various offstage and onstage events, bringing laurels to the school with their outstanding performances.

In the offstage events, Liana Ann Bossan of Class IX secured 3rd Position in English Essay Writing (Category 3) with an A Grade, Riya Mariam Mathew of Class XII secured 3rd Position in Cartoon (Category 4) with an A Grade, and Ananya Rachel Bobby of Class XII secured 3rd Position in English Essay Writing (Category 4) with an A Grade.

In the onstage events, Sweara Anna Rony secured 2nd Position in Monoact (Category 4) with an A Grade. Niranja S of Class XI bagged 1st Position with an A Grade in both Classical Music and Violin (Eastern). Abhishek P of Class IX secured 3rd Position in Mridangam (Category 3) with an A Grade.

In group events, the teams secured 2nd Position in Group Song and Western Music Concert, and 3rd Position with an A Grade in Group Dance (Category 2). The teams that participated in Mime, Kolkali, Patriotic Song, Thiruvathira, Margamkali, and Group Dance (Category 3) also delivered commendable performances and earned A Grades.

The achievements of our students at the Sahodaya Kalolsavam brought great pride and recognition to the school.

Further adding to these achievements, the CBSE State Kalotsav was held from November 12 to 15 at Labour India Public School.
